

Fortune Favors started with OBE via the FFI Fellows program, previously known as Wisconsin FaBcap Accelerator, in 2019. From there, they were referred to the award-winning UW-Madison SBDC, which was recognized as the **2023 Great Lakes Regional Small Business Development Center for Excellence in Innovation**.



Siren Shrub Co. (SBDC + FFI + CTC)

This women-owned business, **featured on Season 8 of** *Project Pitch It!*, makes flavorful combinations with its shrubs — nonalcoholic syrups made from apple cider vinegar, fresh fruits, roots, and herbs, which are then sweetened with cane sugar or maple syrup.

Siren Shrub connected to UW-Stevens Point SBDC in 2019 for assistance with a working capital loan. The business's skills were advanced in FFI's Financial Management Boot Camp, and they utilized the CTC's Ideadvance program to expand their offerings.
